HARALD PAGER (1923 – 1985) - A DREAM SERIES

Jung viewed dreams as expressions of our deeper, sacred Self, using the language of symbols and mythic images. The meaning of dreams fascinated us since the dawn of time as if we intuitively knew dreams bring insight and wisdom from our deeper Self. Dreams are a crucial part of the healing and transformation process Jung called individuation since dreams work towards the integrating of our conscious and unconscious lives. Individuation can be imagined as the psyche's quest for wholeness.

The dream series of Harald Pager (1923 – 1985) beautifully illustrates how the unconscious confronts us with our inescapable personal truth: the dreams of this nonbeliever turned religious. Harald, born in Germany, served during WW II as a young tank soldier when Germany invaded Russia. In 1955 he emigrated to South Africa where he undertook the immense task to document the rock paintings of the Bushpeople. For 8 years he transcribed rock paintings of almost 900 different sites onto over 6 km of drawing paper. He considered this "the great task of his life". However, his many dreams during this time, written down in his Diary and Night-time Notes, tell another story: his "real task" was a religious quest ...

More About the Presenter

Peter Ammann is a founding member of the International School for Analytical Psychology in Zurich, where he is a lecturer, training analyst and supervisor. After training as a cellist, he was encouraged by Jung himself and by his analysts, Jolande Jacobi and Marie-Louise von Franz, to enter Jungian studies. He graduated from the C. G. Jung Institute Zurich in 1965. Simultaneously, he completed his doctorate at the University of Zürich in the fields of musicology, history of religion and ethnology. He maintains a practice in Zürich and lectures regularly in many countries.

His 1984 encounter with Laurens van der Post inspired his enduring interests in Africa, the Bushpeople, their rock paintings, and in African Traditional Healing. Since 1990, when he was invited by Vera Bührmann to give seminars in Cape Town, he regularly lectures here and made several documentary films in Southern Africa, for example Laurens van der Post – The Bushmen and their Stories; Vera Bührmann - Living in two Worlds; Healing in two Worlds – Jungian Psychotherapists encounter African Traditional Healers.
